Mike Williams is currently teaching multimedia journalism (photo, video and web) in Cagli, Italy as part of a study abroad program sponsored by Marquette University. This is his 5th year with this program in Italy. While in Italy, he presented, via the Internet and Face Time, a session on Social Media Metrics and Analysis to attendees of the National Tribal Public Health Summit in Tulsa. The conference, sponsored by the US National Indian Health Board was last week. Williams' session was in coordination with presentations by Prof. Teresa Lamsam, of Univ. Nebraska-Omaha, and Stacy Braiuca, Research Associate, Center for American Indian Community Health at the University of Kansas Medical Center. He also completed web production of the second edition of *Military-Media Issues*, an online journal serving as a forum for viewpoints concerning the military-media relationship. *Military-Media Issues* is produced by the J-School in cooperation with the [U.S. Army Command and General Staff College](http://www.usarmycommandandgeneralstaffcollege.com) at Ft.
