

Faculty and Staff News

Please welcome **Gerri Berendzen**, who is the new editorial adviser of the University Daily Kansan and Kansan.com. She previously was a Knight visiting news editor at the Columbia Missourian and a visiting assistant professor on the Print and Digital News faculty at the University of Missouri School of Journalism. Associate Professor Yvonnes Chen's lead-author article was accepted for publication in Health Communication. Funded by a NIH R01 grant, the study validated a media literacy scale focusing on sugary drinks and found that the scale is predictive of adults' consumption patterns. Her collaborators included faculty from Virginia Tech (Jamie Zoellner and Kathleen Porter) and University of Nebraska Medical Center (Paul Estabrooks).

Chen, in collaboration with Assistant Professor Ward Lyles of Urban Planning, delivered two breakout sessions at KU's 2016 Teaching Summit on Aug. 18. Chen and Lyles discussed key issues to engage non-U.S. students and enhance their success at KU. Participants walked away with multiple strategies, techniques and specific tools to effectively support non-U.S. students.

A research paper by **Associate Professor Hyunjin Seo** and Ph.D. student **Husain Ebrahim** has been accepted for publication in the journal Media, War & Conflict. The paper, "Visual Propaganda on Facebook: A Comparative Analysis of Syrian Conflicts," examines roles of social media in international conflicts.

Seo offered two social media workshops in August. The first was for military officers participating in the Army Strategic Broadening Program (Mount Oread Leadership Series) covering social media and network analysis in foreign affairs. The second, focused on social media and integrated communications, was for KU Madison and Lila Self Graduate Fellows. The Self Fellowship program is aimed at identifying, recruiting and providing development opportunities for "exceptional Ph.D. students" at KU.

Associate Professor Carol Holstead has begun volunteering as a reader at the Audio-Reader Network, a free service for the blind and visually impaired in Kansas and western Missouri. Volunteers read daily newspapers, magazines and books, which are available for listening 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Volunteers must pass an audition to become readers. Holstead reads The Holton (Kansas) Recorder.

Assistant Professor Jonathan Peters' article "Shield laws and journalist's privilege: The basics every reporter should know" was published in the Columbia Journal Review.

Matt Tidwell has a new position as education program manager for the Integrated Marketing

Associate Professor Jerry Crawford was interviewed by Houston Public Media's Laura Isensee, as part of her NPR report on the rising Latino enrollment at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs).
