Pulliam Journalism Fellowship interviews set for Oct. 21

A representative from the Pulliam Journalism Fellowship will be in Lawrence on Saturday, Oct. 21, to interview students for its 10-week summer internship program, which is June 4-Aug. 10, 2018, at the Indianapolis Star or Arizona Republic. The internship pays each fellow up to \$650/week for 10 weeks. Juniors, seniors or graduate students enrolled at the J-School as of Nov. 1, 2017, and committed to a career in news journalism are eligible to apply and interview. It is recommended that student candidates possess the following experience by spring 2018: two or more semesters of on-campus, campus media experience; or one or more off-campus journalism newspaper or media internships. In-person interviews do not

replace the official application process but provides the fellowship judges with supplemental information to consider along with the official application.



JTech Tips

JTech Tips will feature helpful hints and suggestions from **Heather Lawrenz** to make your tech life at the J-School smoother. This week's tip:

File extensions

File extensions can tell you a lot about what is going right (or wrong) with a project. Typically a program's native extension will look similar to the program's name. For example, the extension for Photoshop native files is .psd and the extension for Microsoft Word documents is .doc or .docx. The extension is at the end of the document's name and is preceded by a '.'



One common error is for users to put in additional '.' which confuses what the actual extension is. For example, naming a document REALLY.final.doc instead of REALLYFINAL.doc. The program automatically adds the extension, so just remember to keep file names simple. Some extensions are not easily recognizable. IF you are having trouble opening, displaying or printing a file, begin by examining the file type and then converting the type to a more common, usable file type. By googling the file type you can easily find what you can convert it to and what can be used to convert it.
